#### WATER

According to the National Water services of to drink, with the exception of a few rural areas. Restaurants, hotels and other facilities with water tested regularly.



#### **ELECTRICITY**

Panama's electrical system is compatible with that of North America, 110 volts, so you will not need a grounded plug-ins are uncommon in some hotels though.



#### **SOUVENIRS**

Some of the souvenirs most sought after are the wooden handicrafts such as beautiful boxes, calendars, and fruit bowls. Other nice souvenirs are coffee, coffee liquor, and colorful T-shirts.

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#### **PASSPORT & VISA**

All American and Canadian citizens must have a passport which is valid for at least 3 months after your return date. No visa is required for stays up to 90 days.



#### TIME ZONE

Panama is on Eastern observed.



WiFi WiFi is available at the hotels/lodges but may be slower than what you're accustomed to.



#### **CURRENCY**

The local currency for Panama is officially the Panamanian balboa. However, the U.S. dollar is the currency used day to day throughout Panama. ATM machines are readily available in bigger cities and currency can be exchanged at most hotels and airports. Most major credit cards are commonly accepted.



#### **IMMUNIZATIONS** While no immunizations are required you should consult your medical provider for most current advice. See travelers handbook for more information.
